Stepan Burachok's Critical Assessment of Mikhail Lermontov's Lyrical Poetry Egor V. Sartakov

The article analyzes an assessment of Mikhail Lermontov's lyrical poetry, his only lifetime poetic collection "Mikhail Lermontov's poems" (St. Petersburg, 1840), expressed by Stepan Burachok, the editor of the conservative magazine Mayak. The moralizing pathos and emphasized piety of Burachok's criticism determined his negative assessment of the ideological content of Lermontov's collection, although due respect was given to the perfection of the poetic form. According to the Mayak editor, Lermontov's attitudes were based on egoism and profound willfulness which led to the poet's conflict with the surrounding world. As a matter of fact, the features of Lermontov's lyrical hero were associated with the poet himself seen by Burachok as a person who was hopelessly far from religion and national spirit.
